If you enjoy visiting places with independent shopping; beautiful walks; delicious local food and fascinating local history - then the market town of Faversham is right up your street.

Renowned for its picturesque buildings and historic Market Place, Faversham has been home to a thriving market for over 1,000 years. **Faversham Charter Market** trades on Tuesdays, Fridays and Saturdays.

The town also boasts an impressive selection of unique shops and businesses, perfect for essential and leisure shopping. You can also enjoy a bite to eat at one of the town's excellent pubs and cafés.

Faversham is the ideal place to combine a spot of shopping with a walk down medieval Abbey Street and along Faversham's beautiful creek. You can visit **Standard Quay** with its terrific selection of antiques shops and lovely places to eat on the way.

The Visitor Information Centre at 12 Market Place has excellent information on what to do in Faversham, including a selection of leaflets with self-guided walks around the town centre and nearby villages. For an in-depth insight into Faversham's fascinating history, book to join a Historic Faversham Guided Walk, which starts from here.

Faversham has a fine selection of charters including a copy of the Magna Carta, which can be viewed for free at the Magna Carta Exhibition located at 12 Market Place.

NOT TO BE MISSED

A trip to Faversham isn't complete without a tour of the country's oldest brewery, **Shepherd Neame**. Following this, pop to **Creek Creative Gallery** for freshly prepared lunch, surrounded by exhibitions of local artwork.

Learn about Faversham's fascinating history at the charming Fleur de Lis Museum, which explores the town's colourful past and day-to-day life of Faversham people over the centuries.

To keep the kids amused, visit **Faversham Pools**' heated indoor and outdoor swimming pools. Its outdoor green spaces are the perfect spot to sunbathe and picnic after your swim. Alternatively, take the family to the **Royal Cinema** and enjoy a film in this traditional, independent cinema.

OUT OF TOWN

With picturesque villages and stunning countryside to explore, Faversham is the perfect place to enjoy a day trip or short break.

Faversham is surrounded by popular attractions, many of which host events, activities and festivals. These include 'A New Day' music festival at Mount Ephraim in August; food workshops at Macknade; workshops at Belmont House and fruit-related events at Brogdale.

Belmont House and Gardens in Throwley is an 18th century house containing the country's finest selection of antique clocks. It's set in beautiful grounds including a pinetum, grotto, walled garden and Victorian greenhouse.

Brogdale Collections on the edge of Faversham is home to the world's largest collection of temperate fruit trees. Explore the beautiful orchards with a guided tour.

Visit **Doddington Place** surrounded by wooded countryside for stunning gardens featuring immense yew hedges and a large Edwardian rock garden.

Children love **Huckleberry Woods** micro-animal adventures, located just outside Faversham, with its menagerie of cute miniature animals. You can pre-book walks and experiences with pigs, alpacas, sheep and donkeys.

Macknade Food Hall on Selling Road is a must for all those who love their food and drink, with an extensive selection of produce from Kent, the UK and Europe.

Mount Ephraim at Hernhill boasts ten acres of Victorian landscaped gardens complete with a lake, bridges, rock garden and maze. All overlooking Kent's beautiful orchards and farmland.

Another fabulous spot to take the children is the award-winning **Oare Gunpowder Works**. This nature reserve is packed with wildlife for visitors to enjoy whilst learning about the history of Oare's gunpowder production.
